Participation Conditions

- must concern the Gaia-X ecosystem and not only a single project
- should use Gaia-Compliance Document 24.11 (v2, Loire) and GXDCH for compliance validation.
- might improve Gaia-X experience, on-boarding or help spread knowledge within the community or they can remediate technical debt, improve Gaia-X components quality or address business needs that are not yet fulfilled
- Most of the implementation must be done during the hackathon

Evaluation Scheme



Creativity

- Novelty: how new is the idea (versus the old)
- Uniqueness: Is the idea different?Does it stand out from the baseline?
- Technical Complexity: Is the project technically challenging? Does it utilize complex technologies?

Functionality

- Implementation: Does the hack work as intended?
- Usability: Is the project easy to use and navigate?
- Execution: How well is the hack executed?

Value & Impact

- Business value: What are potential benefits?
 Does the hack solve a real-world problem?
- Social impact: Are there potential societal benefits?
- Usefulness: Is the hack practical?Will someone use it?

Community Impact & Presentation

- What positive community impact may this create?
- How well did the team communicate?
- How well did the team respond to questions?

scoring: 1-5 points (5 is best score) per criterion per judge
